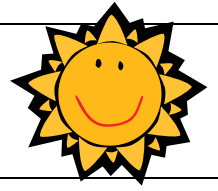


JENNINGS SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER ACADEMY JUNE 8– JULY 14, 2009



ATTENDANCE

Students who enroll in the Jennings Senior High Summer Academy must attend each day of the program. Beyond this, attendance is kept by the hour, so any student not meeting the attendance guidelines will be dropped from the program and not receive credit for the course.

CALENDAR

The Jennings Senior High Summer Academy will be divided into two (2) thirteen day sessions with all classes meeting Monday – Friday from 7:45 AM until 12:25 PM.

Session I will begin June 8 and end June 24, 2009.

Session II will begin on June 25 and end on July 14, 2009. Please note that summer school will not be in session on July 3rd.

TUITION

Most summer school courses are offered at no cost to the student. However, fees to cover actual cost may be necessary for some activity trips.



REGISTRATION

To register, complete and return the application form to Jennings Senior High School, 8850 Cozens Ave., Jennings, MO 63136, by May 15, 2009. Confirmation of acceptance to the Summer Academy will be made by June 1, 2009.

PHILOSOPHY

Core Competency Classes

Core competency classes will be offered in the areas of math, science, history, and English.

The main goal for the core competency program at the Jennings Senior High Summer Academy is to strengthen the skills that the students are deficient in based on their daily classroom performance and scoring based on the End of Course exam format for mastery learning. These classes will assist, strengthen, and provide students with an opportunity to practice and enhance their abilities in the four main core classes.

The Summer Academy is designed for those students who need to make up credits in the core subject areas. The remaining “slots” will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis depending on the date the student’s registration form is received.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

All courses will be taught using the key concepts from course offerings from the 2008-09 school year.

Students can earn one-half (.500) credit for each summer school course that is successfully completed.

Students may enroll in one course each session based on availability.

Enrichment Classes

Enrichment classes are available in the areas of public speaking, music appreciation, ACT prep, etc. Students must have passed all four core classes being offered in order to enroll in an enrichment class.



FOOD SERVICE

There will be a breakfast and lunch program for the Senior High Summer Academy. Prices for breakfast and lunch will be the same as during the regular school year. Students will be able to put money in their accounts; however, accounts will not be allowed to run deficits.

SUMMER ACADEMY BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS

During Summer School, all Jennings High School students will be expected to follow the same guidelines and expectations as during the regular school year.

ATTENDANCE -

Students will be expected to be in attendance on a regular basis. Because each session will consist of 13 days, all students must attend school on a daily basis to earn credit. Daily attendance is expected to be from 7:45 AM to 12:25 PM.

Students may not exceed more than 6 hours of absences to earn credit for the summer session in attendance.

Arrival time between	7:45-8:45	=	1 hour absence
	8:46-9:45	=	2 hours absence
	9:46-10:45	=	3 hours absence
	10:46 & after	=	4.5 hours absence

STUDENT BEHAVIOR -

The following incidents will result in automatic removal from the summer program:

1. Fighting/assault
2. Possession of a weapon or drugs, including alcohol
3. Possession or discharge of fireworks
4. Theft
5. Vandalism to school property
6. Other incidents as outlined in the conduct and disciplinary code of the high school
7. Defiance/Disrespect of any staff member

MINOR OFFENSES -

Students who commit a minor offense as outlined in the Student Handbook will be treated as follows:

TARDINESS to school and return from class breaks:

Students who are late to class or returning from breaks will lose one hour of attendance for each tardy.

CLASS DISTURBANCE:

First incident - student sent to administrators with referral. Student will be sent home for the remainder of the day.

Second incident - student will be sent to administrator with written referral. Student will be removed from program for the summer.

STUDENT SMOKING ON CAMPUS:

Students will not be allowed to smoke on school grounds.

STUDENT AUTOMOBILE USE:

Students who desire to drive to school will be allowed to do so. All student drivers will be asked to park in the middle and last section of the parking lot only. All drivers are asked to drive with caution at all times while on the parking lot and to and from school.

STUDENT VISITORS AND GUESTS:

Students may not bring visitors (family members, or guests) with them while in attendance at summer school. No exceptions will be made and any students reporting with a visitor will be sent home with time deducted.

***ALL STUDENTS MUST BE OUT OF THE BUILDING AND OFF GROUNDS BY 1:20 DAILY.**
